Hale Irwin himself would agree as he describes the course as "near perfect, with views of open meadows and mature wooded areas."

Reward the winner by letting him buy a round at Lafayette Brewing Company. Choose from a wide selection of handcrafted ales brewed in the Old World tradition that make the perfect complement to the tasty pub fare and live entertainment served up at this award winning restaurant.

DAY TWO you'll need to grab a coffee for an early tee time at Purdue University for a round of Big Ten golf. Play Ackerman Hills, Purdue's 18-hole, par-71, traditional, parkland-style, championship golf course for a course that will leave your self-confidence in tact. If you're looking for a course to challenge even the highest level of golfer, try Purdue's Pete Dye designed, 18-hole, links-style, par-72 Kampen Course. You might bring your beach towel because this course serves up plenty of sand. The die hard golfers have even been known to play all 36 in one day with lunch in between at the club house.



Every 36 hole day deserves a hearty shepherd's pie or fish and chips paired with an Irish beer at Nine Irish Brothers. After dinner Buffalo Wild Wings is just a putt away. Head over and catch a game before turning in.

DAY THREE it's off for a short but worthwhile drive Southwest to Harrison Hills Golf Club. Ranked by GolfWeek Magazine "3rd Best Affordable Golf Course in Indiana," this 18-hole championship course, laid out on over 200 acres of rolling hills with spectacular views, offers bent grass tees, greens and fairways. Be sure to put your order in at the Country Club Grill before you head home.
